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Brief Description of the concession

PT Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah is a company engaged in the forestry industry with a core business of cultivating *Acacia mangium* and *Eucalyptus* for the production of pulp fiber and paper.

PT Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah received Decree No. SK.67 / MENHUT-II / 2007 dated 23 February 2007 concerning Renewal of IUPHK-HTI PT.BBSI on Production Forest Area of approximately 13,420 hectares in Riau Province, (entirely limited Production Forest (HPT), located in Indragiri Hulu Regency, valid for a period of 41 years from 23 February 2007, unless reassigned by the license holder or revoked by the Minister of Forestry and which cannot be renewed).

Decision of Decree of Indragiri Hulu Regent Number: 331 Year 2002 dated 6 November 2002 concerning Business License for Utilization of Forest Timber Forest Product (IUPHHK-HTI) An. PT Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah for an area of approximately 13,420 ha located in Peranap and Kelayang Sub-districts, Indragiri Hulu Regency, is valid from November 6, 2002 for 35 years plus one cycle of staple crops.

PT Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah has not converted any natural forest or non-forested land into plantation forests after December 31, 2010, and thus the total area for IFCC certification is 13,420 ha.

The Management Unit has carried out spatial arrangement in accordance with the Revised RKUPHHK-HTI Document for the 10-year Period of 2008 - 2017, which has been endorsed by the Ministerial Decree Environment and Forestry No. SK. 2593/MENLHK-VI/BUHT/2015 dated June 18, 2015.

HTI spatial plan based on Revision RKUPHHK-HTI is as follows:

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The working area of PT Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah Management Unit is located between 00^o 35' 43" to 00^o 47' 52" South and 102^o 00' 39" to 102^o 08' 07" East. It falls under the governmental administration of Peranap Sub-District, Indragiri Hulu Regency, Riau Province, with boundaries to the North: PT Rigunas Agri Utama; South: PT Rigunas Agri Utama; East: Ex HPH PT Patriadi and SKPH Anak Talang; and West: KUD Serangge Permai, Tani Pura Usaha, Rahma.

The working area of the Management Unit has a largely flat topography (0-8%) of 91.99%, with remaining 8.01% being sloping (8-15%) at an altitude of 30 to 535 meters above sea level. According to Schmidt-Ferguson climate classification, PT. Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah is included in climate type A with a value of Q = 14.3%. The entire working area of PT. Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah is on mineral land with podsolik red yellow soil type (PMK). The Management Unit has thus decided to develop the *Acacia mangium* and *Eucalyptus pellita* species.

Description of the socio-economic conditions of the concession and the concession's social programs

Located in the Regency of Indragiri Hulu, the villages surrounding PT. Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah are located in three subdistricts, with the majority of their population being migrants from North Sumatra.

PT Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah conducts social management based on mutual understanding and cooperation in order to improve the economy of local society plus also foster harmonious relationships with the company. The Management Unit targets the development of job creation and/or business opportunities for the local residents around the concession area in order to help raise the income level of the local community. Other targets include raising the standards of healthcare provision and of education in the area through its Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR) programs.

Agreements have been reached in regard to the livelihood plants (rubber) and access is provided to the local community to utilize forest resources such as honey and rattan on the proviso that no damage is done to the plantation operations. In a spirit of cooperation and inclusiveness, the Management Unit socializes its activities to both employees and the local community to promote understanding of responsible forest management for the benefit of all, plus is mindful of its own responsibilities to assist the surrounding communities in meeting their cultural and religious obligations. In this way PT Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah hopes to develop positive attitudes and perceptions of the local community towards the company and its operations.

Description of the Ecological conditions of the concession

PT Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah undertakes activities to minimize negative environmental impacts in accordance with RKL (Environmental Management Plan) and RPL (Environmental Monitoring Plan) documentation, the results of which are reported to the requisite authorities on a periodic basis. Among the impacts monitored are various indicators relating to the health of the soil and the quality of the water.

In addition to the regular inventory and mapping of the flora and fauna as required for biodiversity management within its concession area, PT Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah pays particular attention to its protected areas. Measures undertaken to protect these areas include the marking and monitoring of their boundaries, socialization of the areas to the public, employees and their families, maintaining an inventory of their contents and implementing regular patrols.

Monitoring the protected areas covers the monitoring of all plants in the area, including enrichment planting, for outbreaks of disease or infestation by pests, regular inventory of flora and fauna, and field observation of river water quality.

One area of particular concern is the potential for forest and land fires and PT Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah has formed and

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trained firefighting teams who monitor potential hot spots. The Management Unit also controls the build-up of wood waste and ensures that access roads are kept free from constraints. Further actions include the installation of information boards prohibiting the lighting of fires in the forest and regular patrols are also carried out to minimize negative impacts due to illegal incursions or forest/land fires.

The management unit has developed and implemented SOPs for the management of Hazardous Toxic Materials (B3), which include an inventory of waste, source, and estimated amount. All such waste is regularly collected and retained in temporary storage until its collection by a licensed disposal company.

Results of the Public Consultation

Prior to carrying out the Surveillance 1 Audit, PT AJA Sertifikasi Indonesia conducted public consultation commencing February 06, 2017 asking stakeholders to provide feedback and information on PT Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah. The public consultation was uploaded to the PT AJA Sertikasi Indonesia website (<u>www.ajaindonesia.com</u>), sent to relevant parties by email and/or postal mail, and announced in local newspapers.

PT AJA Sertifikasi Indonesia received no input from stakeholders during the public consultation and no environmental or social conflict issues were reported. The audit team also gathered information from the mass media about PT Bukit Batabuh Sei Indah, such material being considered material in the audit process implemented by PT. AJA Sertifikasi Indonesia.

The Management Unit has identified all the requirements required for this certification process, comprising legal aspects that include compliance with international rules and conventions. The management system has been built to include all activities in the field of certification, which is registered for an area of 13,420 ha.

Conditions under which the certificate is issued
