Brief description of the concession

Management Unit's concession area is based on the Decree of the Minister of Forestry Number: 38/Kpts-II/1996. About "Provision of Industrial Plantation Forest Concession Rights over a forest area of approx 296,400 ha, located in the Province of Level I, South Sumatra to PT Musi Hutan Persada. Stipulated in Jakarta, January 29, 1996.

Within the Management Unit area there has been no conversion from primary or secondary forest into plantation forest areas since December 31, 2010, so the scope for IFCC certification is 296,400 hectares.

Management Unit has Revised Document for the Work Plan of Industrial Plantation Forest Product Utilization (RKUPHHK-HTI) for the ten-year period of 2010 to 2019 on behalf of PT. Musi Hutan Persada in South Sumatra Province, which has been ratified through the Decree of the Minister of Forestry Number: SK.45/VI-BUHT/2011 on March 30, 2011. The Spatial Planning is as follows: Staple Plant Area: 150,673 ha (50.83%), Livelihood Plant Area (including for indigenous species and infrastructure): 86,267 ha (29.10%), Protected Area: 44,098 ha (14.88%), and Areas Ineffective for Operation: 15,362 ha (5.18%); percentage total due to rounding.

PT Musi Hutan Persada is geographically located between the coordinates 02° 40' to 04° 45' South and 102° 45' to 104° 30' East, while based on management area they are as follows:

- Area I Subanjeriji: 3° 30' to 4° 00' South and 103° 50' to 104° 15' East;
- Area II Benakat: 30 00' to 30 40' South and 1030 10' to 1040 00' East;
- Area III Lematang: 4° 05' to 4° 20' South and 104° 15' to 104° 30' East.

Locations based on governmental administration are as follows:

- Lahat Regency, Kota Agung District, Kikim.
- Muara Enim Regency, with Regencies: Tanjung Agung, Rambang Dangku, Rambang Lubai, Muara Enim, Gunung Megang, Talang Ubi.
- Ogan Komering Ulu Regency: Martapura District, Lematang
- East Ogan Komering Ulu Regency.
- Musi Rawas Regency. Rupit District.
- Musi Banyuasin Regency.

PT Musi Hutan Persada concession area is located at between 5 and 310 meters above sea level (EIA 1996). The topography consists of 149,526.45 ha of flat slopes (0-8%), 134,248.25 ha of ramps (8-15%), and 12,625.40 ha of slightly steep slopes (15-25%). Hydrology is connected with the Musi watershed, and Lematang, Semangus and Keruh subwatersheds. The climate conditions are Climate Type A according to Schmidt-Fergusson with annual rainfall of 2,769.2 mm with the dryest month being July and the wettest March.

Based on the foregoing, the staple plant species cultivated are Acacia mangium and Eucalyptus pellita.

Description of the socio-economic conditions of the concession and the concession's social programs

There are no indigenous peoples in the concession area of PT. Musi Hutan Persada, the closest being Anak Suka Dalam, a local community that is generally considered to have been pursued into the forest two hundred years ago. The main local community group today is Malay, which traditionally occupies a large river area, while transmigrant groups of Javanese and Balinese are also to be found in the area.

The community domiciled in and around the concession area provides a sizeable source of labor, which is at least partially involved in the company's operations as permanent employees or on contract working for third-party contractors, outsourcers, etc., or as entrepreneurs with their own business activities.

In its employment practices, the Company recognizes government regulations and ratified ILO conventions, is careful not to employ underage workers, and allows for optional union membership, etc. In addition, it monitor and evaluates operational and management systems, both internal and external, in regard to contractors to ensure the safest working conditions.

The company also has intercropping agreements with local villagers providing them with benefits from planting crops such as upland rice, vegetables and corn in the concession area. Based on the agreement, the community is provided access to enter the forest area to collect other non-timber forest products under the provision that they do not use fire to clear the land.

At the company's concession location, MHP has implemented a management program called Managing Collaborative Forests (MHBM) that aims to manage forests in collaboration with communities located within the concession area so as to generate benefits for both parties. This program applies to the second rotation forest developed in the area which is the company's concession area. Under this program, communities are recognized as direct stakeholders in forest management and receive benefits in the form of wages (operational, management and production), short, medium and long-term work and business opportunities, and agrotic opportunities (fisheries, livestock and secondary crops). The area designated for MHBM covers 86,267 hectares. In addition, the company has a joint venture with local communities on an area of 11,167 ha in a program called Managing Community Forests - MHR. This business is on community land whose legality can be proven to facilitate community involvement in forest development and provides benefits to both MHP and the community. Under this program, forests are developed and managed in the management system, and communities benefit through job opportunities and profit sharing from harvesting and selling forest products.

PT Musi Hutan Persada has demonstrated its commitment to the well-being of the surrounding community by ensuring basic food aid flows during the harsh rainy season when villages have been flooded with floods that have stopped normal activities. As part of a community development program, the program also focuses on providing opportunities for children and the younger generation.

Description of the ecological conditions of the concession

The Management Unit has identified forest management activities that have important impacts, and conducts environmental impact assessments through: RKL, RPL and EIA Documents of PT. Musi Hutan Persada, March 1996 approved by the Ministry of Forestry's EIA Commission No. 51/DJ-VI/AMDAL/1996 12-4-1996, with reports being delivered to the requisite authorities on a periodic basic.

Reduced Impact Logging activities are carried out in stages, pre-harvesting, during harvesting, and post harvesting.

Management Unit has carried out biodiversity management through the identification and inventory of endemic, rare flora and fauna and endangered species and their habitats in the area in accordance with applicable regulations through the

inventory activities that have been carried out. There is also a map of flora and fauna distribution, which details their habitat and migration patterns.

Management Unit carries out forest protection activities, be these natural or human as likely source. Natural disturbances include infestation by pests and disease, for which the MU has standard procedures for the controlled use and disposal of hazardous and toxic materials (B3). Measures have also been implemented for fire protection, while there are no livestock grazing activities permitted the local community.

Results of the Public Consultation

Prior to carrying out Surveillance Audit 2, PT AJA Sertifikasi Indonesia conducted a public consultation commencing December 20, 2018, whereby stakeholders were asked to provide feedback and knowledge about PT Musi Hutan Persada. The public consultation was uploaded to the PT AJA Sertifikasi Indonesia website (www: ajaindonesia.com), sent to parties via e-mail or letter, and published in local newspapers. Although relevant parties had been notified prior to the Surveillance 2 Audit, there was no specific input received from stakeholders as a result of the public consultation.

The audit team also collected information from the mass media about PT Musi Hutan Persada, such reports being given material consideration in the audit process conducted by PT AJA Sertifikasi Indonesia.

Management Unit has identified all the requirements needed for the certification process, consisting of legal aspects which include compliance with rules and regulations and international conventions. The management system has been built to cover all activities in the field of certification, which are registered for certification covering an area of 296,400 hectares.

Findings on the certified client conformity with the certification requirements and description of critical issues in relation to the conformity.

The results of PT Musi Hutan Persada's Surveillance 2 Audit, identified five (5) minor non-conformities (NC), as follows.
