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Brief Description of the concession

The permit of PT Korintiga Hutani is PBPH (Forest Utilization Business Licensing). PT Korintiga Hutani has received a forest utilization permit since 1998 and has undergone several changes. The final decision letter is the Decree of the Minister of Environment and Forestry of the Republic of Indonesia Number: SK.717/MENLHK/SETJEN/HPL.0/9/2021 dated 13 September 2021 of 94,384 Hectares in Central Kalimantan Province. In carrying out operations, the company has an RKUPH document (Forest Utilization Business Work Plan) for the 10-year period of 2021 to 2030 which was ratified by Decree of the Minister of Forestry and Environment Number SK 6422/MenLHK-PHPL/UHP/HPL.1/11/2020 dated 27 November 2020. There are no conversion of natural forest to plantations, thus the scope of IFCC certification is 94,384 hectares.

The organization has carried out spatial planning of its work area into Protected Area of 18,992 Ha (20.12%) and Cultivation Area of 75,392 Ha (79.88%) totaling in 94,384 Ha (100%). The Cultivation area of 75,392 Ha (79.88%) consists of Self-management pattern of 66,024 Ha (69.95%), Partnership pattern of 6,252 Ha (6.62%), Infrastructure area of 3,116 Ha (3.31%).

Location of the forest is geographically located at 111° 28'00" to 111° 55'00" East and 1° 62'30" to 2° 20'00" South. Administratively, the government is located in the districts of Menthobi Raya, Bulik, Sematu Jaya, South Arut and North Arut in the West Kotawaringin Regency and Lamandau Regency, Central Kalimantan Province. Accessibility to the work area can be reached from the provincial capital, Palangkaraya, by land, river or air. Travel time from Pangkalanbun City is approximately 1.5 hours to Pellita base camp (PT Korintiga Hutani). PT Korintiga Hutani PBPH area boundaries, namely:

- North side: PT. Intrado Jaya Intiga,
- East: PT. Arut Sawit Mandiri,
- South side: PT. True Mendawa Partners,
- West: PT. Gemareksa Mekarsari.

The general condition of PT Korintiga Hutani is as follows:

- Rivers: Seimentajai, Sei Peguluman, Sei Uwah, Sei Moa.

The species developed for production are Acacia mangium, Eucalyptus pellita, and red jabon (Anthocephalus macrophyllus), white jabon (Anthocephalus cadamba).

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Description of the socio-economic conditions of the concession and the concession's social programs

PT Korintiga Hutani has thirteen target villages. Based on the Community Identification Report around the PT Korintiga Hutani area, the livelihoods of the surrounding residents are mostly farmers or 57% of the total population. In the work area of PT Korintiga Hutani there are customary law communities. The company made commitments to the local village communities in 2012, represented by 3 villages. The commitments are that PT Korintiga Hutani will protect Bukit Sepanjung and Bukit Balang area as a conservation area based on the traditional territory.

PT Korintiga Hutani has established an agreement with the community. There are Joint Agreement concerning the Construction, Improvement and Maintenance of Inter-Village Connecting Roads, Forest Right Community Plantation and Forest Partnership Cooperation. The company made Cooperation Agreement with 3 local contractor partners. There is Community Collaboration Concerning Fire and Utilization of NTFPs as well.

PT Korintiga Hutani has provided adequate support for the empowerment of local communities. There is an Operational Plan for PT Korintiga Hutani Corporate Social Responsibility Program for 2022 and 2023. The realization until the end of December is 67.14%. The 2022 Corporate Social Responsibility activities realized include honorary teacher salary, religious teacher / spiritual officer, national holiday fund, traditional event fund, repairs to houses of worship. As for 2023, the Management Program realization until the end of December is 543.44%. The activities in 2023 include honorary teacher salary, religious teacher, scholarships for higher education, funds for local crafts and UMKM, maintenance of access roads in assisted villages, repairs houses of worship, Construction of the Lamandau Consortium Road, Inauguration of the Lamandau Consortium Road, repair of school buildings, etc.

There is remaining conflict land in 2023 which is still in the resolution process. Based on interviews with five village officials, there is no open conflict with the surrounding community. Most of the community's claim areas have been resolved by the company, either through compensation or through forestry partnership (HTR) cooperation. As for further settlement efforts, some of the claim areas are in the process of being resolved. The remaining conflict land in 2023 is in 16 locations. Based on information from the BPD Representative and a village representative, PT Korintiga Hutani has provided compensation for the land of the community.

Description of the Ecological conditions of the concession

The organization has carried out forest ecosystem and hydrological function management through the following activities:

- Identify forest management activities that have significant impacts and carry out environmental impact assessments through PT Korintiga Hutani RKL and RPL, PBPH AMDAL Documents (Approved and Ratified by the Forestry Department AMDAL Commission No 48/DJ-VII/AMDAL/97 dated 12 March 1997, Environmental Permit by the Governor of Central Kalimantan on 27 October 2010 (recorded in the OSS System). The organizations performed implementation of environmental management and monitoring every semester and presented in the Environmental Permit Implementation report (RPL/RKL).
- Reduced Impact Logging activities are performed before, during and after logging.
- Identify areas that function to protect land and water. This is an area designated as a Protected Area of 18,992 ha (20.12%) consisting of River Borders of 7,540 ha (7.99%), KPPN of 300 ha (0.32%) and KPSL 11,152 ha (11.81%).
- Monitoring of negative impacts of forest management activities in concession areas in accordance with the environmental assessment documents and SOP for Monitoring Protected Areas, SOP for Monitoring Discharge and Water Quality and SOP for Erosion Monitoring.
- PT Korintiga Hutani has documented procedures for the controlled use of B3 (Hazardous and Toxic Materials), namely SOP for Management of Hazardous and Toxic Waste (B3), SOP for Handling Spills of Fuel, Lubricants and Chemicals, SOP for Weed Control, and SOP Integrated Pest and Disease Management.

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The organization has carried out biodiversity management through the following activities:

- Identification and inventory of protected, endemic, rare and threatened/endangered flora and fauna as well as their habitat and migration patterns in the PBPH area. The results of the identification and inventory can be found in RKL and RPL, PBPH AMDAL Documents, RKL/RPL Implementation Report (Semester 2, 2022 and semester 1, 2023).
- Identify key species along with their habitats and migration patterns. Based on this identification, there is a key species in the area, namely the Orang Utan (*Pongo pygmaeus*).
- The types of staple crops cultivated are not genetically modified tree species but Acacia mangium, Eucalyptus pellita, and red jabon (Anthocephalus macrophyllus), white jabon (Anthocephalus cadamba).

The organization has implemented appropriate and measurable steps in forest through the following activities:

- Identify and monitor disturbances in Sustainable Forest Management. Based on document review and field verification, forest disturbances generally include danger of forest fires, illegal land encroachment and illegal logging.
- Having documented procedures to prevent and handle pest and disease attacks, namely SOPs for Integrated Pest and Disease Management.
- Regulate the management of chemical pesticides in the field with documented procedures and MSDS.
- Has implemented forest protection measures against fire hazards.
- Prohibition of livestock grazing activities by the community.

Results of the Public Consultation

PT ACube TIC International has made a public announcement and public consultation prior to conducting the Audit of Transition to IFCC ST 1001:2021 + Surveillance 2 and Witness Audit commencing September 15, 2023, asking stakeholders to provide feedback and information about PT Korintiga Hutani. The public consultation was uploaded to the PT ACube TIC International website, sent to parties by email or postal mail, and published in local newspapers.

The audit team also collected information from the mass media about PT Korintiga Hutani. The reported cases are considered as part of the PT ACube TIC International audit process.

There was some positive feedback from two stakeholders:

- 1. On October 25, 2023, the stakeholder stated that the organization has a high commitment in carrying out biodiversity conservation and preservation activities. That the organization has maintained the efforts as concrete evidence of how synergy based on common goals and fundamental values can produce significant positive changes in preserving biodiversity and the environment.
- 2. On October 30, 2023, the Provincial Government One Stop Investment and Integrated Services informed that PT Korintiga Hutani Business Data is in accordance with the data on Online Single Submission (OSS).

Organization progress record related to corrective action on findings of nonconformities in previous audit

There are three (3) minor non-conformities and one (1) major non-conformity during the Surveillance 1 Audit. The Organizations made improvements and the non-conformities are closed.
